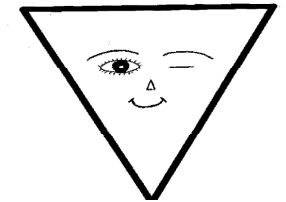

### COALITION ACTION?

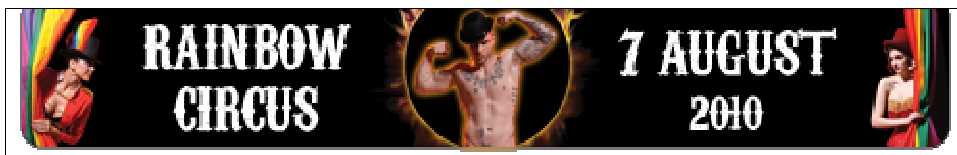
The coalition government has promised action on some gay issues.

## LIVERPOOL PRIDE

**Liverpool Pride** will be happening on **7th August** and the theme is "Rainbow Circus" as voted for by the LGBT community in the city. Talks are under way with the council to hold a march on the day, and street performers, artists and club promoters are working together with the festival organisers to ensure a safe and colourful day for all.

## MANCHESTER PRIDE

Later in the month it's the turn of Manchester to host its Pride festival. It'll be ten days of sport, film, arts, heritage, entertainment and partying, culminating in the Big Weekend on **August 27th—30th**.

Acts confirmed for the main stage include Belinda Carlisle, Heaven 17 and Beverley Knight. Wristbands already on sale for the Big Weekend at an early bird price of £12.50 till July 1st.

More news in our next newsletter about other Pride events which this year include items as diverse as a swimming pool party for trans people, a Pink Dog Show, It's A Gay Knockout, talks by LGBT armed forces veterans, women's events, a ceilidh, sports events including ice climbing and salsa dancing, and an LGBT family fun day.

Marc said: "Since playing Syed I have really got it in the neck when I'm out. A lot of people are supportive but there is still a huge amount of negativity. I haven't been threatened but there's a lot of cat-calling in the street. Any insult, I've had it thrown at me."

But he added that he valued the opportunity to play the character.
